

Copyright Policy and Procedure

Copyright Policy

Liberty Cablevision of Puerto Rico LLC (“Liberty” or the “Company”) is committed to complying with United States and Puerto Rico copyright, intellectual property rights and related laws, and requires all customers and users of the Service to comply with these laws.

Copyright protects original works of authorship, including literary, dramatic, musical, artistic or intellectual, and grants its owner the exclusive right to conduct or authorize others their reproduction, distribution or use. Anyone who violates any of the exclusive rights of the copyright holder is a copyright infringer, unless fair use (or a similar affirmative defense) applies (*See* 17 U.S.C. §102 et seq). Accordingly, you may not store any material or content on, or access, share or disseminate any material or content over the Service (or any part of the Service) in any manner that constitutes an infringement of third party intellectual property rights, including rights granted by United States and Puerto Rico Copyright laws.

Procedure for Submitting a Copyright Infringement Claim

Liberty, as an Internet service provider, is registered under the Digital Millennium Copyright Act of 1998 (“DMCA”) (*See* 17 U.S.C. §512). It is Liberty’s policy, in accordance with the DMCA and other applicable laws, to reserve the right to terminate the Service provided to any customer or user who is either found to infringe third party copyright or other intellectual property rights, including repeat infringers, or who Liberty, in its sole discretion, believes is infringing these rights. Liberty may terminate the Service at any time with or without notice for any affected customer or user.

Copyright Owners

Under the DMCA, copyright owners have the right to notify Liberty if they believe that a Liberty customer has infringed the copyrighted owner’s work(s). If you believe that a Liberty customer has copied your work in a way that constitutes copyright infringement, you may file a Notification of Claimed Infringement with Liberty’s designated DMCA agent. The DMCA provides the following procedure for parties to follow who wish to file a Notification of Claimed Infringement with Liberty.

To be effective under the DMCA, the Notification of Claimed Infringement must be a written communication provided to Liberty’s designated agent and must include the following information:

1. A physical or electronic signature of a person authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed.
2. Identification of the copyrighted work claimed to have been infringed, or, if multiple copyrighted works at a single online site are covered by a single Notification, a representative list of such works at that site.
3. Identification of the material that is claimed to be infringed or to be the subject of infringing activity and that is to be removed or access to which is to be disabled, and the infringing IP address, time, date, and the time zone to permit Liberty to locate the material.
4. Reasonably sufficient information to allow Liberty to contact the complaining party, such as an address, telephone number and if available, an electronic mail address at which the complaining party may be contacted.
5. A statement that the complaining party has a good faith belief that use of the material in the manner complained of is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law.
6. A statement that the information in the Notification is accurate, and under penalty of perjury, that the complaining party is authorized to act on behalf of the owner of an exclusive right that is allegedly infringed.

Upon receipt of a Notification of Copyright Infringement from a copyright owner that contains the required information described in 1 through 6 above, Liberty will notify the customer of the alleged infringement and remove or disable access to the material that is alleged to be infringing if hosted on a Liberty domain. No personal, customer information is shared with the copyright owner unless required by law.

Customers

If you have received a notice of copyright infringement and you believe that a copyright holder has accused you erroneously, you may file a DMCA Counter-Claim with Liberty's designated agent.

To be effective, a Counter-Claim must be a written communication provided to Liberty's designated agent and must include the following information:

1. A physical or electronic signature of the customer.
2. Identification of the material that has been removed or to which access has been disabled and the location at which the material appeared before it was removed or access to it was disabled.
3. A statement under penalty of perjury that the customer has a good faith to belief that the material was removed or disabled as a result of mistake or misidentification of the material to be removed or disabled.

4. The Customer's name, address, and telephone number, and a statement that the customer consents to the jurisdiction of Federal District Court for the judicial district in which the address is located, or if the customer's address is outside of the United States, for any judicial district in which the service provider may be found, and that the customer will accept service of process from the person who provided notification or an agent of such person.

Upon receipt of a DMCA Counter-Claim, Liberty will provide the complaining party with a copy of the DMCA Counter-Claim. When Liberty receives a Counter-Claim that meets the requirements of the DMCA, Liberty will process the Counter-Claim in accordance with the requirements of the DMCA.
